A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.




We are here to tell you about all this, and so is the Holy Spirit, who is God's gift to everyone who obeys God.

C is for Chanel

St Mary's College, as we know it now, was formed in 1988 when St Mary's High School for girls amalgamated with the Marist College for boys which was located on Cottingham Road. The Church for the Marist College was,



and still is, called the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes and St Peter Chanel. As a result St Peter Chanel was adopted as the name of one of the St Mary's College houses and the 'C' corridor is also dedicated to him.

"But what is he famous for?" I hear you ask. Well, Fr Peter Chanel was a priest of the Society of Mary, the Marist Fathers. He wanted to be a missionary and was given the task of bringing Christianity to the New Hebrides, a group of islands off the coast of New Zealand. After a very shaky start - which included Fr Peter being clubbed to death by a local tribal chief! (there is a particularly gruesome statue of this event in the church which bears his name) - this was eventually achieved in 1836, five months after Fr Peter's death.

The Society of Mary, otherwise known as the Marist Fathers has long had a great presence in Hull and have always been involved in education. The Marist College was on Cottingham Road and was one of the two schools which amalgamated to form St Mary's college. Marist Fathers are renowned for working in communities, for teaching, and for

having a very grounded approach to living their faith and to passing it on to others. They are very accepting of everyone.
