I will:-

- Arrive for training and matches in good time to prepare thoroughly
- Arrive for training and matches with appropriate kit for the activity including personal protective equipment such as shinpads
- Always warm up and cold down effectively
- Play for fun and enjoyment-not just to please parents/carers and the team manager
- Accept responsibility for my own attitude, behaviour and performance during training and matches; representing St Mary's College in a positive way
- Play by the written and unwritten rules allowing safe and fair play at all times
- Always accept and respect the referee's decisions
- Not shout at players or referees in anger
- Not use unsuitable or inappropriate language
- Set a positive example for others, particularly younger competitors and spectators
- Be an outstanding sportsperson and role model (win with modesty and lose with dignity) and appreciate good play on both sides
- Only make positive comments from outside the field of play if watching a game as a spectator or substitute
- Respect opponent's and opposition team managers and spectators before, during and after the competition- treat them as you would wish to be treated yourself
- Co-operate with your team manager, coach, team mates and opposition
- Take care of all property
- Let a teacher or adult know if others are not following these rules
- Report any discriminatory behaviour or language to the teacher in charge of your team
- Not wear any jewellery, unsuitable clothing or footwear during any event
- Inform the teacher or team manager of any injury immediately
- Thank the team managers, teachers, coaches, officials and supporters after the competition

I understand that I may not be able to take part in any extra-curricular sports fixture, training or club:-

- If I have been involved in a serious pastoral incident
- If I have to attend a lunchtime or after-school detention
- If I have persistent kit problems in Physical Education lessons
- If I have three yellow cards in a half term in Physical Education lessons
- If I have five or more yellow cards in a half term in the school curriculum
- If my attendance is below 97% and not showing any improvement
- If my effort on my termly report is deemed unacceptable and no sign of improvement is evident
- If my homework on my termly report is deemed unacceptable and no sign of improvement is evident
- If my punctuality is a persistent reoccurring theme
- If I fail to maintain the SMC Standard

I will:-

- Remember that doing one's best and taking part is paramount
- Encourage fair play by supporting all players
- Teach my son/daughter to treat players, teachers, coaches and officials with respect
- Make sure that I do not argue with officials, teachers and coaches and will accept their decisions
- Be a positive role model for my son/daughter and set a good example by being a good sportsperson to both teams
- Not coach my son/daughter during matches
- Never force my son/daughter to take part
- Ensure that my son/daughter has the correct kit and equipment for the activity and has plenty of water to drink
- Never punish or make fun of a child's poor performance or their mistakes
- Support my son's/daughter's involvement and help them enjoy sport and physical activity
- Ensure that I do not smoke, vape or drink alcohol on a school site when spectating
- Not swear or use unsuitable or discriminatory language
- Not take photographs or videos unless given permission by the member of staff in charge of the activity
- Fully co-operate with all health and safety guidelines set out by St Mary's College

I understand that I may be <u>unable</u> to spectate at any extra-curricular sport fixture if I am breach of any of the above guidelines and may be asked to leave the site immediately
