A number of bespoke opportunities for enrichment occur in this term such as the residential Oxbridge visits for SM6 students. Y10 will also begin to complete their Log On Move On to identify appropriate next steps for them as an individual.

BM4- Linking curriculum learning to careers

The delivery of careers is explicit through PSHE, particularly in KS4 and 5. Other opportunities for careers in the curriculum are through lesson delivery. Delivery is mapped in each subject department curriculum learning journey. There are also opportunities for students to explore careers in the curriculum through extra-curricular activities such as the MHSCA in SM6 and Medical Mayericks in KS3.

BM5- Encounters with employers and employees

Construction company Hobson & Porter engage with Y8 students on their Teamwork Challenge project: to build a school.

BM6- Experiences of workplaces

Year 10 work experience week commences this term with all students expected to complete a full week (37.5 hours) in an appropriate placement.

Opportunities for volunteering through student leadership for all year aroups.

BM7- Encounters with FE and HE

Students in Y12 will have the opportunity to attend the University of Hull's UCAS fair where they can explore the course options at a range of HE institutions.

BM8- Personal guidance

All students in Y11 and 13 will receive a meeting with a careers adviser (Mrs Connell and/or Mr Charlton). Y10 and Y12 students of greatest need will begin 1-1 careers guidance meetings during this term to provide early intervention support.
