Following their lesson on the National Grid, Y9 Science students were tasked with creating a model of the National Grid, to include a power station, step-up transformer, pylon, step-down transformer, and a consumer, such as a house. They are now able to understand where electricity comes from and how it is transformed and distributed across the UK.

Additionally, the class also learned about mains electricity, during which they were taught how to safely wire a 3-pin plug. One young man in the group surprised his teacher, producing the most accurately and safely wired plug she had ever seen! Perhaps a career in electrical engineering is on the horizon!






It's always sad to say goodbye to our student leavers. We celebrated their time with us with leavers' assemblies, a mass and of course the most glamourous proms in town!!
