- White Ribbon Day was created to raise awareness of the violence women and girls face. Although we recognise that violence inflicted on <u>anyone</u> is wrong, women and girls suffer a disproportionate amount of violence in comparison to male counterparts. This year White Ribbon Day falls on the same week as the start of the Men's World Cup and will therefore highlight 11 traits men and boys can nurture to help create a world of equality and safety for women in order to prevent violence in the future. These 11 traits will be known as #TheGoal and are ally, caring, empathetic, courageous, gentle, resilient, reliable, hopeful, principled, reflective and supportive.
- All year groups have taken part in the thumb print pledge to promise to never use, excuse or remain silent about male violence towards women and girls. The whole of SM6 have taken their pledge by creating an aerial drone picture of a white ribbon on the school's 4G pitch to embody #TheGoal theme for this year's White Ribbon Day. SM6 Social Activists have also taken a leading role in creating white ribbon badges and creating an ally wall to show support for all women and girls with the next fundraising event dedicated to raising money for Purple House- a women's shelter in Hull.




Super Science Work

Geography visit to The Netherlands

Year 10 & 11 students recently enjoyed an educational adventure to The Netherlands. With an early start to their journey at 5:15am early in November, they boarded the Pride of Hull ferry to Rotterdam. Fantastic food and great entertainment on board made for an enjoyable overnight journey and the students all managed to get some sleep in their cabins on the notoriously rough seas. Disembarking the next morning at 9am in

Rotterdam, the first activity of the day was a visit to the Neeltje Jans Delta Park, which consisted of a tour of the flood defences that protect the city and surrounding areas of Rotterdam from storm surges. The students were able to get up close to some wind turbines and experience the aquarium of the sea life from the surrounding seas. From there they headed into the city of Rotterdam for an overnight stay where the group stayed in the famous cube houses and experienced the famous market hall where many delicious delights were sampled. The next day the group headed to the Clara Maria Cheese and Clogg factory before moving onto the Zaanse Schans UNESCO world heritage site. Students had the opportunity to see some cloggs and cheese being made and sample some of the delicacies on offer. The UNESCO world heritage site had a museum with a guided tour and ended with some time to buy those all-important souvenirs. The return ferry journey from Rotterdam was equally good, with great food and students and teachers pitted against each other in a music quiz. The students were amazing and had a thoroughly wonderful time.
