St Mary's College is delighted to have been chosen as one of the final fifteen from over 1,500 entries across the UK to have their own illustrated bench created and displayed at the Tower of London during the Coronation celebrations in May. Taking inspiration from teaching resources developed by Historic Royal Palaces (HRP) – the charity that cares for the Tower of London – pupils at St Mary's College have designed their own colourful Coronation benches, around the theme of values for a new era. Children and young people from across the UK were invited to think about their hopes for the future, alongside the symbolism of the upcoming Coronation, and to create their own bench designs as a visual representation of these ideas.

Pupils at St Mary's College, who worked on the successful design, will have the chance to work with global public art producers Wild in Art to refine their illustrations, before their bench is brought to life and installed at the Tower of London during the Coronation celebrations. These students have been invited on a VIP class trip to the Tower of London as a reward for their efforts, where they will see the Crown Jewels, take part in themed activities, and have the opportunity to see their bench in situ.

Head of School, Maria Stead is understandably immensely proud of this accomplishment, "I had every faith that we would be able to win this most prestigious of awards due to our amazing, highly innovative and creative Art & Design Department not to mention the talent of our students. I am so excited that we have been awarded a Coronation Bench, a design focused on everything we believe in at our school and in the UK. Our Coronation Bench will have a place in history whilst being seen by millions across the world.


There are over 60 students at SMC with a diagnosis of a Neurodiverse condition so it is really important we recognise Neurodiversity Celebration week. Our Neurodiverse students enhance and enrich our school community - they see the world in different ways and add an inspiring dimension to the college.

Due to our Neurodiverse cohort being so important to us at SMC, all staff recently received training from the Northcott Outreach Team on how to engage and support students with ASD. This provided an excellent opportunity to reflect on our practice and implement additional support strategies for our Neurodiverse cohort.

It also provided some of our students with ASD with the opportunity to share their experiences of

SMC - some of their reflections are here:

- "Autism makes me see and understand things differently"
- "Autism changes how you do things but I
 don't see it as a bad thing. I'm proud of
 my Autism. I want to share it with people
 not keep it to myself. I think it's
 important teachers know I have Autism
 as then they know how to help me."
- "My brain is wired differently so I think and process things differently"
- "Staff are good at understanding my difficulties with eye contact. They also let me work at my own pace"

A RECIPE TO TRY FROM MRS FISHER

Herby Spring Chicken One Pot

Minimise your washing up with this delicious one pan chicken pie with spinach and herbs and topped with crispy filo pastry. It's ideal for busy week nights



Ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil, plus a little extra for brushing over
- bunch spring onions, sliced into 3cm pieces
- 250g frozen spinach
- 6 ready-cooked chicken thighs (or see tip, below)
- 350ml hot chicken stock
- 1/2 tbsp wholegrain mustard
- 200g frozen peas
- 200ml half-fat creme fraîche
- small bunch parsley, finely chopped
- 270g pack filo pastry

- •STEP 1 Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Heat the oil in a large, shallow casserole dish on a medium heat. Add the spring onions and fry for 3 mins, then stir through the frozen spinach and cook for 2 mins or until it's starting to wilt. Remove the skin from the chicken and discard. Shred the chicken off the bone and into the pan, and discard the bones. Stir through the stock and mustard. Bring to a simmer and cook, uncovered, for 5-10 mins.
- ½ small bunch tarragon , leaves finely chopped •STEP 2 Stir in the peas, crème fraîche and herbs, then remove from the heat. Scrunch the filo pastry sheets over the mixture, brush with a little oil and bake for 15-20 mins or until golden brown.
