Hello and welcome to the October edition of the St Mary's College newsletter. I have been very proud to work at St Mary's College for many years. Whilst safeguarding children is a responsibility of all staff, in my role as DSL I work with an experienced team to ensure that all staff work collaboratively within the school and with other agencies so that we can keep children safe, happy and able to learn.

You may have seen in the national news that in June last year Ofsted published a report into sexual abuse within schools. In September we launched the **#My Pledge** initiative where we shared our common view on how we should behave towards each other. This can be found in the student planner and is displayed throughout the school.

In September we formed a partnership with National Online Safety - a global leader in supporting parents and teachers to navigate the challenges of social media. Through our work we have achieved Certified School status for Safeguarding and Online Safety. # CATHOLIC LIFE - THE CHURCH YEAR AND ITS COLOURS

The colours of the Liturgical Year were introduced almost a thousand years ago, when most people who attended church were illiterate and all services were celebrated in Latin, which most people didn't speak.

The colours are a simple visual clue to everyone, showing which time of the liturgical year we are in.

This is why pupils and teachers should notice different colours in our Collective Worship slides, in the Chapel and in our Reception.

#### WHY GREEN?

Green is the colour of Ordinary Time, the time of the Church's year that we are currently celebrating.

The clue is in what else is green: grass, leaves, trees, moss. Just look outside your window on any Spring or Summer day to notice that we live in a green and growing place. So, that's why green: this is our growing time. This is a time to learn more about God's plan and listen more carefully to God's Word.


### FUTURE LEADERS
